Eggstraordinary tale rules the roost at Kelpies Prize 2013

Youngest-ever winner Alex McCall takes home children's fiction prize for Attack of the Giant Robot Chickens

Scottish publisher Floris Books, fresh from their domination of this year's Scottish Children's Book Awards, yesterday revealed first-time children's author Alex McCall as the winner of their annual Scottish children's fiction prize, the Kelpies Prize.

The announcement was made at an exclusive ceremony at the Edinburgh International Book Festival attended by award-winning authors, agents, booksellers and bloggers. Celebrated children's author Vivian French, best known for *The Tales from the Five Kingdoms* and the *Tiara Club*, presented the award. Vivian's speech praised the Kelpies Prize for its commitment to younger readers, inspiring a new generation of "readers for life".

At 19 years old, Alex McCall is the youngest-ever winner of the Kelpies Prize. His name was announced to a giant cheer from the crowd. Taking to the stage to thank his friends and family for their support, he also congratulated his two fellow shortlisted authors. McCall received a cheque for £2,000 on the evening (see overleaf) and his winning entry, *Attack of the Giant Robot Chickens*, will be published in the Kelpies range in spring 2014.

Also shortlisted were Barbara Henderson from Inverness, author of *Never Back*, which tells the story of TJ and Levi's escape from the mysterious New Dawn institute in remote Scotland and their quest to make sense of both their past and present; and Shona McQuilken from Cambuslang, author of *The Great Moon Mission*, which follows Jimmy and his friends in their attempts to win a competition to travel to the moon — and save the world.

About the Kelpies Prize

Floris Books launched the Kelpies Prize in 2004 with support from the Scottish Arts Council, now Creative Scotland, to encourage and reward Scottish writing for children. Submissions must be set wholly, or mainly, in Scotland and be suitable for children aged 8 to 12. The Kelpies Prize winner receives £2,000 and is published by Floris Books under the Kelpies imprint.

They may not have been previously commercially published, although the author may have been. The judges are looking primarily for a cracking story with strong characters, believable dialogue and a compelling atmosphere. The deadline is 28 February 2014.
