Competition launched for Scottish primary school libraries

One Scottish primary school will win £500 worth of books for their library

Floris Books, Scotland's largest children's publisher, is offering one primary school in Scotland the chance to win £500 worth of books for their library.

The independent publisher is asking primary schools throughout Scotland to send them a photograph of pupils enjoying their Kelpies books plus up to 250 words on why it's important to have Scottish books in their library.

Floris are currently shortlisted for the **Saltire Society Scottish Publisher of the Year** award for, amongst other attributes, publishing books which "play a crucial role in the reading lives of young Scots".
